

Akasha Adonis and 1st alternate Timothy Kelly. Both are on their way to Miss Gay USofA at Large 2017. You girls did amazing.



No Way But Broadway

"Hold the vision; trust the process". As I sit down to write my first entry to the Integrity Newsletter, I can't help but think of where this all began. I started the art of Male impersonation six years ago. My intent back then was to have fun, explore my gender identity, and have a creative outlet. Little did I know that this identity I made for myself would

turn into a deep passion of mine. I was introduced to the world of pageantry through veterans that came before me and was told a great deal about the Phoenix Pride system. My start into pageantry was tumultuous and was definitely an uphill battle. I won my first title at a local bar in Phoenix, which was a prelim to Mister Phoenix

Gay Pride. I was young, naive, and somewhat thick headed. I lost the chance to compete for the Pride title through varying circumstances and was beyond crushed. This was my first lesson on resiliency. After spending much time reflecting on the person I want to be and why I enjoy being a male impersonator, I dusted myself off and competed the following year. After again winning a title that earned my entry to Mister Phoenix Gay Pride, I knew it was time to prove myself to the community that I grew to love. Through love, commitment and devotion, I won Mister Phoenix Gay Pride in 2014. I spent the next year building my name in Phoenix and building my brand as an entertainer. My queen Barbra Seville and I spent countless hours raising money, being visible and leaving a legacy. During that time, Brandon Packer came home with the Mister USofA MI Classic title and reintroduced me into national pageantry. I remember meeting Eazy Love that fall and him begging for me to compete in the USofA

system. I unfortunately turned him down that year and told him that my job as Mister Phoenix Gay Pride wasn't done and my focus is on the community and finishing my

ence was a huge shock to me. My first year was one of the most exhausting, exciting and eye opening experiences I have ever had. And I loved every second of it.

I left that year as second alternate to the legendary Abs Hart. Obviously after making it that close to leaving with the crown, it can be jarring. But I placed higher than most Arizona kings before me, which was extremely humbling. Placing top 12 my first year, let alone top 3 was certainly an accomplishment and I definitely was proud of this. I genuinely didn't know if I was going to come back the following year. I had been going through pageantry and community service for about 4 years without a stopping and felt my body needing a break. When I brought this up to family and friends, they would say things like "do what you need to do" or "I'll support you in whatever decision you make". But then would also say "you did come so close" and "you have a chance at this".

The push I needed came from Brandon Packer and the Tennessee family. Even after earning my ticket as Mister Tennessee USofA MI, I felt myself being extremely unsure of myself. The next three months seemed to fly by faster than I could keep up with. The support I had during that time however is unlike anything I have ever experienced in my life. I was able to raise enough money to not only deliver the package I dreamed of but also fly 5 others across the country with me. "It takes a village".

This year it was my goal to prove to myself that I am a leader in this community. Despite my timid nature, I branched out, talked to my brothers, and just let whatever happens happen. Nationals week this year was beyond the toughest I have ever experienced. Everything went wrong (whether real or imagined). I left interview feeling badly. I left Creative Evening Wear prelim night feeling badly. And finally had a wardrobe malfunction in my talent prelim night that sent me on a tailspin. I thought I lost my chance. I pushed through the pain and continued to be present for my brothers and sisters. Classic night came and I had a chance to regroup and just let off steam. During Val's stepdown I began crying. I didn't stop crying until well after Ivory was crowned. In these moments of exhaustion, I saw what the reign meant. It all hit me like a ton of bricks and I said to Sonja Jae Savage, "I get it". "I get the brotherhood now". "I get the importance of this title".

My wife sent me a song in the morning of finals called "don't look down". I had the fire back in me that day. I also genuinely knew that whatever happened, I would leave happy. This top 12 was some of the most talented group of people I had the privilege of being with. I modeled my heart out and performed as hard as I could. The time came for the categories and the top three. "Talent, Eddie Broadway". For those that know my history you know that I am okay not winning a crown as long as I win talent. That award felt like a million bucks in my hand. 2nd alternate and 1st alternate was then called. Seeing my brother D'Angelo and

Chase Sky light up as they were called for top three was so incredible. Either one of them are made for this title

"Winner, Eddie Broadway". I remember hearing my brothers Bastian, Viktor and Abs saying "brother, that's you". The crown felt heavy, but not uncomfortably so. It felt right, like it was made for me. My dream became reality in that moment. All the struggle, times of strife, self-doubt just slipped away. "Hold the vision, trust the process".

I understand the weight of this title and what I need to do for all of us. With my extremely talented, beautiful and knowledgeable counterparts Ivory and Seduction next to me and guiding me, I know this will be a year for the books. This year and reign will be about community service and giving back to all of you. Organizations that you are all passionate about will be served and we will do our best to make each of our little communities better. As I have said before, this title will be shared with all of you. 
